


Kia ora October 12 2021

Eighteen year old Laetitia has been a parishioner since 2009. Having attended Stella Maris, she is now a Year 13 student at Carmel College.

Laetitia has been a familiar face at Serving Spoons since it first started, taking the day off school every month to volunteer at the lunch. Outside of school Laetitia is a busy teenager - she takes guitar lessons and trains in Tae Kwon Do (on green belt now).

She has also been swimming with the Special Olympics Hibiscus Coast Club since 2013. Together with her team, she has represented the club at numerous events including the 2016 Trans Tasman Tournament in Hamilton and the 2017 National Summer Games in Wellington. The Nationals are held every 4 years and she and her team were meant to compete at this year's Nationals in Hamilton but this has now been rescheduled to next year due to COVID-19.

Laetitia is a true believer that superheroes walk amongst us, and at age 16, she wrote a children's book titled "The Awesome Superheroes - The Bank Robbery". Her 2nd book is now in draft. In her free time, Laetitia can usually be found meticulously working on her crystal art and has completed many pieces. This year, she was awarded the Mercy Award at Carmel Day Mass at school because she "... epitomises respect, care and empathy for others. She reminds us that believing in ourselves opens us up to opportunities, adventures and achievements."

Laetitia has Down Syndrome and as she navigates life, she reminds us that not all superheroes wear a cape. October is Down Syndrome awareness month – "We Stand Together, E Tu Tangata".

At this time, we also ask that you please stand together with our Down Syndrome community and say a prayer for Lena Zhang Harrap, a 27-year-old young lady with Down Syndrome who, on 22 September 2021, had her beautiful light brutally extinguished in Mount Albert. *May Lena's soul rest in peace and her family be wrapped in the comfort of love. Introducing the Finance Committee

Purpose of the Finance Committee

Under Cannon Law, the Finance Committee for the parish is primarily concerned with helping the Parish Priest in fulfilling the Mission of the Church in terms of:

- To ensure that the parish has the assets and facilities (such as church, presbytery, hall, etc.) to carry out its mission and for the financial support of those involved in the pastoral works of the parish, i.e. the Parish Priest, staff, pastoral assistants, etc.
- To plan and budget for the financial resources needed now and in the future, and
- To account for, administer and safeguard all parish income, expenditure and assets.

In effect, this means that the Finance Committee:

- Accounts for all the income, expenditure, assets and liabilities of the parish,
- Prepares financial reports to the committee, government and the Diocese,
- Ensures compliance with GST and payroll requirements of the IRD,
- Maintains all the buildings, equipment and fixtures of the parish, and
- Is responsible for Health and Safety in the parish.



Bruce Harrison (PPC Secretary) shared this recently on our FB page:


